Saturday

On Saturday could you please – like the organising team – take Covid Lateral Flow Tests for each crew member. If positive or you feel unwell on Sunday morning, please stay at home. We won't need to see your test kit or email/text confirmation.

Sunday

Set out from home on Sunday morning with any of the above documentation, your RS Clubmans or other licence, map 154 (any reasonably up-to-date edition), Romer* (a device to plot a map reference), a full tank of fuel (in case of crisis), pens, warm clothing (weather is forecast to be dry but cold) and smiling faces.

At the Start/Finish venue, employ good Covid practice: sensible distancing and no hugging of the organisers for putting on a splendid event. Optionally wear a mask if it makes you feel more comfortable.

Aim to arrive at the start around 11:30 for light refreshments, competitor chat and any questions for the organising team, and collect:

- a) your (crudely made but useful) Romer* if you don't have one
- b) your Answer Card for the codewords you will hopefully find
- c) the Master Locations Table

and check out the samples of the codewords that will be hidden.

At 12:00 we will issue the Starting Locations list. This will be cryptic clues to the exact location of the first level (A1-A16) of codewords. We recommended you solve the clues and plot the locations on your map before you leave. "Dryhen" and "Crow" will hover to give hints if necessary. Plotting might take you half an hour (refreshments still available) but it will help you plan your route/strategy for the afternoon. You'll still have four and a half hours for travelling and searching.

We want you back for 17:00 for the buffet. After that you'll incur penalty points and the food may be depleted by those more timely. We hope to have results (and awards 😊) by 18:00.
